A Proud Heritage and a Bright Future

Mother Emily Gamelin, the founder of the Sisters of Providence religious order, is the guiding spirit of our organization. Around 1830 in Montreal, Canada, Mother Gamelin devoted herself to improving living conditions for older widows by opening the House of Providence. She and others also opened an orphanage, visited prisoners and cared for the mentally ill.

Inspired by Mother Gamelin, Mother Joseph of the Sacred Heart and several other Sisters of Providence traveled from Montreal to the Pacific Northwest in 1856. They established the Sisters of Providence in the Northwest, and opened 33 different institutions including hospitals, schools, orphanages and homes for the elderly.

Today, more than 150 years later, their legacy is carried on by more than 18,000 employees who are dedicated to furthering their compassionate tradition and our Mission in the world of today.
