These words from the family of a hospice patient echo the sentiments of so many who have found comfort and an improved quality of life from the superb team at Providence SoundHomeCare and Hospice.

The Providence mission reads: “As people of Providence, we reveal God’s love for all, especially the poor and vulnerable through our compassionate service.” Providence SoundHomeCare and Hospice brings the Providence mission into the home setting. We give hope to people who are suffering or whose lives are in transition.

The dedicated clinical team is committed to providing a high level of service in a caring and responsive manner. The home care and hospice staff work with physicians, patients, caregivers, and family members in an effort to meet each patient’s unique needs, regardless of their ability to pay.

In 2010, Providence SoundHomeCare and Hospice provided healthcare services to more than 4,600 patients in our community. Clinicians traveled to the outer reaches of Mason, Lewis and Thurston Counties to care for nearly 3,000 home health patients, more than 500 mothers and infants, and more than 1,000 terminally ill patients and their families.

Bereavement in-services and support groups were held in various locations throughout the community for individuals of all ages experiencing the death of a loved one, and included Coping with Holidays workshops, a monthly Breast Cancer support group, and annual Light Up a Life tributes to celebrate people we love and admire.

Providence Hospice Volunteers continued to give generously of their hearts and time throughout the year. More than 6,500 hours of essential services were provided by 90 volunteers. Volunteers provided respite care for caregivers, companionship for patients, and handled tasks such as running errands, cutting hair, light housekeeping, meal preparation and gardening.

Volunteers are also key to our 11th Hour Program that helps to ensure that no one dies alone and that caregivers get the support they need during this difficult time.

Gifts Support SoundHomeCare and Hospice

Gifts to Providence St. Peter Foundation make a tangible difference in the lives of Providence patients, families and staff. Patient care, health education and vital equipment purchases have all been made possible through charitable contributions.

A few examples of how gifts directly impact the quality of care in 2010 include:

Funds used for Hospice Support

Respite Care support - 1,100 hours = \$27,000
Comfort Care Therapies - 450 hours = \$23,000
Hospice staff education - \$8,395

Funds used for Home Health Support

Light of Hope: During 2010 we distributed gift cards, gas cards, and electric bill payments for our Maternal Child Health and Home Health clients totaling \$2,798. Some of these funds were also used for communication for the deaf including a door bell that used lights versus sound.

Staff Education: A total of \$15,167 from the foundation was spent on staff education particularly for the rehabilitation staff to assure their exceptional expertise.

Equipment: We invested \$3,740 for oximeters so our clinicians can provide vital care to our cardio/pulmonary patients. This has been part of a collaborative effort with local hospitals and nursing homes to keep these patients from readmission to hospitals.

Margaret, who had been living with Alzheimer's disease for four years, was nearing the end of her life. She was residing at her daughter Charlene's house and was to the point where she required around the clock care – more than her daughter could handle alone. Charlene arranged for Providence SoundHomeCare Hospice nurses to take care of Margaret's medical needs. "The Hospice staff helped me through a period where I could no longer handle the care for my mom without help. Before SoundHomeCare and Hospice, I rarely left my mom's side; I was exhausted from providing the constant care she needed and I was scared. The help and support that I received was unbelievable. The Hospice staff became part of my family. I could depend on regular phone calls and visits from the nurse. A nursing assistant was assigned to bathe my mom and volunteers were available to give me desperately needed time away from home to run errands and rest. The Hospice team relieved my fears and I was able to keep my mom at home."

Margaret passed away a few months later. "The last nine months of my mother's life were emotionally difficult for me. I could not have made it though this emotional 'roller coaster' without SoundHomeCare and Hospice. The treatment and care that my mother received was respectful and loving."

Last year, Providence SoundHomeCare and Hospice reached out to more than 1,000 hospice patients, like Margaret, and their families. Donations to Providence St. Peter Foundation and Providence Centralia Foundation enables staff at SoundHomeCare and Hospice to continue to provide these comprehensive services to all in need, regardless of their ability to pay.
